"Περίφρασις" between Ancient and Modern Greek Languages: Through the Comedy of Aristophanes and Σταύρος

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Abstract:

Linguistic change is a feature of intellectual and cultural development, and the Modern Greek Language is one of the languages that witnesses to the intellectual and cultural development of language from ancient Greek to Modern Greek. So the Modern Greek even retained many characteristics of the Ancient Greek language. Therefore the researcher studied the Periphrasis style " Π Epí ϕ p α ois" as a comparative study between the ancient and modern Greek languages applied to each of the comedy Aristophanes Aριστοφάνης and compared it to the translation of the Greek poet Θρaσύβουλος Σταύρου, in order to explain the concept of " Π Epí ϕ ρaσis" in The ancient and modern Greek languages and their study grammatical and semantic and morphological study to identify the characteristics of this concept between the ancient and modern Greek languages, and similarities and differences between them and the extent of their common impact.
