Renting Houses in Islamic cities: an archaeological study in light of al-Kindi's story by al-Ğāḥiẓ

Abstract:

Renting houses are an important model for studying city society through dealings and its governing controls. This research paper aims to take Renting houses as a model for the jurisprudence of civil real estate transactions in the Islamic city, by extrapolating the heritage, linguistic and civilizational connotations in al-Kindi's story by the brilliant writer "Al-Ğāḥiẓ", Which their content agreement with the practical reality of the houses from the third century until The fourteenth century after the Hijra in all of the Islamic cities. This extrapolation determines for us the aspects of the functional occupation of this house, and its elements using, in addition to determining the names of those elements and their linguistic and idiomatic connotations.
