The prince Yossef Kamal was known for his passion of arts and also his desire to possess the rare and wonderful antiques. So, there are two unpublished wonderful antiques in his palace, both of them made of brass. The first antique number is 7. It is a lantern dating back to 19th Century A.D. The lantern body contains various decorations like figural, animal and floral motifs. Moreover, the decoration method that that was executed on the lantern is incising and perforating style. The second antique number is 78. It is a big bowl dating back to 19th Century A.D. The decoration made by prominent engraving style. Furthermore, it is a clear that these antique has an Indian style decoration. It should be mentioned that after the description and analysis study there were some new results about the exactly kind, functional purpose and date of these antiques. Although there are no inscriptions, dates and also there is no signing manufacturer on both of two unpublished models.
