A rare copper dirham minted by Hussam al-Din Yulaq Arslan al-Artuqi (580-597 AH / 1184-1200 AD) mourning the death of Salah al-Din al-Ayyubi in the year (589 AH / 1193 AD).

## **Abstract:**

Islamic coins are an honest mirror that reflects the events of Islamic history in various fields, political, religious, sectarian, economic, social and others.

In this research paper, the researcher presents documentation of a rare copper dirham minted by the ruler of **Artuqid** in Mardin, Hussam al-Din Yulaq Arslan, mourning and mourning the death of Salah al-Din al-Ayyubi (589 AH / 1193 AD). Yubis, and after the death of Salah al-Din al-Ayyubi, Husam al-Din Yuliq Arslan minted this dirham in his desire to clarify his grief over the death of Salah al-Din, and an attempt to please and approach the just king, Salah al-Din's brother. Weights: The weights of these coins ranged from 13:18 gm, as they are commemorative coins.
