The Features of Scientific Rationality in The Post-Modernist philosophy of Science Khaled A.Qutb

The Scientific Reason in the Post-Modernist philosophy of Science reconsidered the foundations, methods, concepts, and scientific theories which the modernist scientific rationality justified and maintained them as fixed and comprehensive facts.

The Post-Modernist philosophers of Science claimed that the scientific understanding does not rely on a range of fixed scientific methods, rather on the human interests, interpretations, values and backgrounds. Those human considerations play an important role in the process of understanding the phenomena and science itself. Therefore, the Post-Modernist philosophy of Science rejected the traditional concept of truth and rationality.
