Summary of the Research

The title of this research is "The Impact of Virtual Doctrine on Grammatical Studies both in the Past and at Present". The significance of the research lies in examining the two-way relationship between some branches of knowledge, including basically grammar and Jurisprudence, then the sciences of the holy Qur'an and the Prophetic Traditions (the Sunnah). The ultimate goal is to investigate the virtual doctrine and track its impact on the traditional as well as recent grammatical studies. This type of study reveals the overlap as well as integration between legislative and grammatical sciences in addition to the wide knowledge of our scholars and thinkers.
