**The influence of Egyptians in the scientific movement
in the honorable city during the eighth century AH**

The research dealt with the efforts of Egyptians in the activity of the scientific movement in the honorable city during the eighth century AH, .which had its causes, fields and manifestations

The reasons for this were the following: Political subordination of the honorable city to the Mamluks, the religious status of the city, and the scientific movement in it. In addition, the flourishing of the scientific movement in Egypt attracted many civilians. The pilgrimage also had an impact on the contributions of the Egyptians in the scientific life in the honorable city. Finally, sectarian conflict between Sunnis and Shiites was another reason that encouraged Egyptians to participate in the scientific .movement in order to support the Sunni sect

The fields in which Egyptians contributed to enriching the scientific movement in the honorable city include: religious jobs, spending on scholars and students, organizing scientific seminars, issuing fatwas and .jurisprudential rulings

As for the manifestations of the Egyptians' contributions in the scientific movement in the honorable city, among them are the large number of Mujawereen, most of whom were scholars. In addition to the stability of a number of Egyptian families in the honorable city, their sons inherited science and some religious posts, as well as the participation of Egyptian .scholars in the scientific movement of different religious or secular sciences
