

The Companion Kharijah Bin Hudhafa Al-Adawi and his family in Egypt, (from the conquest until the Umayyad period)

Abstract

Kharijah Bin Hudhafa al-Adawi: a great companion of the narrators of the Noble Prophetic Hadith of the Prophet, participated in the work of the Islamic conquest of Egypt with Amr ibn Al-Aas, and stayed there. He took over the judiciary and police for Amr during his mandate over Egypt, and he selected a house in Fustat and resided in it. To him is attributed the conquest of a number of Islamic cities in Upper Egypt, the most important of which is the City of Fayoum. He was killed by the Kharijites in Ramadan in the year 40 AH out of deceit and error. They thought that he was Amr Ibn al-'Aas, may God bless him and grant him peace, and his sons and his family continued after him in Egypt, enjoying prestige and the protection of the Umayyad's in appreciation of Kharga. The research attempted to document the events, and discuss the problems related to the subject, such as: Kharga's lineage and his companions, his role in the conquest of Egypt, and the issue of demolishing Kharga's room and the subject of his death, And his family in Egypt and their relationship with the Umayyad caliphs.
