## Abstract

This study is preoccupied with approaching the phenomenon of exoticism and the mythical mask in the current Arab poetic discourse, in order to clarify the impact of this exoticism as well as the employment of myth in the production of poetry, and an attempt to uncover the roots of cross-cultural anthropology and its role in enriching the poetic text or expanding the scope of the text and making it subject to symbolic interpretation and semantic projection. And revealing the extended human components and intellectual roots that make up the poet's mentality. It takes from the text and its phenomena a way to approach the formative roots in the mind of the producer of poetic discourse and his preoccupations or concerns and ideas.
