Methodological procedures for study

questions of the study

The main question: How effective is the older brother big sister program (Social sponsorship) message association in achieving its objectives?

Branching off from this main question of the following sub-questions :

The first sub-question: To what extent the ability of Big Brother big sister (Social sponsorship) to provide a sense of safety for children beneficiaries?

The second sub-question: To what extent the ability of Big Brother big sister (Social sponsorship) to provide privacy and family atmosphere for children beneficiaries?

The third sub-question: To what extent the ability of Big Brother big sister (Social sponsorship) to strengthen the affiliation of children benefiting from it?

the type of study and the methodology used

2-Provide privacy and family atmosphere for children beneficiaries .

Study tools

1–The measure has been applied through an interview of children benefiting from the program to determine the extent to which the program has achieved the objectives

2–interview form for officials to learn about the difficulties that hinder the program from achieving its goals and how to address them

fields of study

1–the human field of study: (a) intentional sample of children applied their program numbered 87 single has been selected from the five branches of the Assembly in accordance with the following conditions:

*Be enrolled Association message or one of its branches

*To be a child in the age of 6:10 years

*The program is to be applied more than three years on it

(B) Number 10 of those in charge of the program to learn about the difficulties that hinder the program from achieving its goals

2–spatial field: study was applied branches resala charity organization in the governorates of Cairo, Giza, namely: (Maadi, Nasr City, Heliopolis, Helwan, Faisal). It has been selected these branches because of the availability of the age group of children out

3–field time: the period of data collection 01/03/2012 to 15/03/2012

Results of the study
