Research Summary

Evaluation of Work Programs in Groups for the Development of Social Incorporation Skills in Autism Children

An Applied Study to Autism Centers in Fayyoum Governorate

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Study Problem & Importance:

Autism hinders the normal growth of the brain. In autistic children, it is normally a deficiency in verbal and non-verbal communication, the social and emotional interaction, playing activities or leisure time. As a result, it makes it difficult for them to change into independent individuals within the community. They may also show some repeated physical movements (such as: (fluttering of hands and swinging), abnormal responses to others or their fondness of things that belong to others along with their resistance to any change in (routine) matters. In addition, in some cases in autistic children, aggressive behavior may appear. Therefore, if we cannot prevent this case of disability, it is necessary for us to relieve its resultant effects through different programs, which contribute to achieving social incorporation for them. Such incorporation has become an urgent educational issue in the field of special education (Education of Children with Special Needs) particularly the process of incorporating autistic children into their local community, with their families and peers. Out of this point, the notion of this research has emerged, that is, the evaluation of work programs with groups for the development of the social incorporation skills in autistic children.

As work programs with groups aim at acquiring the autistic children some of these skills they need to incorporate into social life and due to that fact that the idea of social incorporation has an importance and impact upon the degree of the autistic child's adaptation to the surrounding community, therefore, **this study problem has been identified in the significant question**:

What is the extent of effect of work programs with groups upon the development of the social incorporation skills in autistic children?

Study Methodological Procedures:

Social survey method with two types: through sampling of families of autistic children and the comprehensive study field of all experts as well as social workers who work in autism centers.

r. Study tools:

- 1) Study tools are represented in a special questionnaire form for all social workers and social Experts who are concerned with autism.
- Y) An interview guide for a sample of autistic children's families.

٤. Study Aspects:

a) Spatial field:

This study has been conducted in some autism centers in the governorate of Fayyoum amounting to (ξ) autism centers.

b) Human Field:

- Y- A comprehensive list was taken of all social workers and social workers who work in autism centers in Fayyoum Governorate amounting to (YY) individuals.
- Y- A sample of families of autistic children, the field of this study, amounting to (1.) individuals.

c) Time Field:

This study has been conducted during the period from 1/(1/1) till 1/(1/1).

Study Results:

This study has concluded the answer to study questions. The responses of the research individuals were relatively strong with regard to the extent of effect of programs of working with groups on the development of social incorporation skills in children suffering from autism. The most important work programs with groups that contribute to the development of the social incorporation skills in autistic children from the point of view of this research individuals are: rehabilitation programs followed by social programs.

This study has also concluded the most important social skills necessary for achieving social incorporation in children having autism from the point of view of these research individuals as follows:

- The skill in achieving the social verbal and non-verbal communication.
- The skill in social interaction
- The skill in achieving self-independence.

This study has also reached the most important professional tactics and skills that can be used for the development of social incorporation skills in children suffering from autism.
