The living conditions and social mobility of poor families are affected by the economic and social developments that the country is witnessing from the processes of change and development that it is going through in the development process, and poverty is more in rural than in urban areas.

Social protection is considered a basic human right, and it plays an important role in reducing and alleviating poverty, achieving equality and social justice and preserving human dignity.

Social protection can be described as a framework that includes a broader set of programmes, stakeholders and tools associated with other options (such as social policies), "social security", "social insurance" or "safety nets". The term "social protection" is used to denote any initiative launched by the sector Public and private, which would provide consumption transfers and sources of income for the poor, protect vulnerable groups from the risks of unemployment, as well as improve the situation of socially marginalized groups, in order to achieve the general goal of reducing the vulnerability of the poor and other marginalized groups at the economic and social levels. Looking at studies conducted on poverty as well as international reports such as human development reports, World Bank reports, local reports and other reports interested in studying poverty and development, it is clear that the percentage of poor people is more in rural areas than in urban areas and other areas, which is a natural result of what these areas suffer from Lack of development programs and projects that help develop services of all kinds and improve people's living conditions, thus achieving prosperity in these communities.

Poverty is a major obstacle to achieving continuous development and raising economic growth rates. Poverty and deprivation pose a threat to the peace, political, social and security stability of society because it provides a fertile environment in which various forms of deviation, extremism and unbridled opposition may eventually target the state itself.
