Abstract:

As one of the studies of the social work profession, the current Study aimed to monitor and determine the Attitudes of rural men towards the human rights of rural women as a basis for reviewing the concepts, perceptions and behaviors of rural men in order to change the negative and strengthen the positive. The study revealed the negative Attitudes of rural men towards the human rights of rural women, particularly economic and social rights. It also revealed that these trends vary according to age, marital status and level of living, and type of family. Single people with university and higher university qualifications and from nuclear families are the most supportive and recognized human rights of rural women in social, economic and political terms. The study noted the need to develop programmes in support of the dissemination of a human rights culture and to raise awareness of the human rights of rural women from the level of theoretical knowledge to actual practice.
