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2	Title	The Role of Members of Boards of NGOs in Facilitating Community-Based Services ; A Study Applied to the Members of the Boards of Some NGOs City of Fayoum.
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Abstract:

Occupies the facilitation prominent operational mechanism concerned with the achievement of the objectives set in advance by the NGOs, at also works to strengthen relations and deepen between the NGOs and community-based organizations of all kinds on the other hand, among NGOs and community residents, and is facilitative one of the mechanisms entrusted with achieving the tasks Minor of NGOs, Namely the provision of goods and services and set up programs, projects and strengthen the partnership between sectors of society, it also facilitates activities of communication and interaction between the Assembly and consumers of its services, as well as the brokering activities, capacity building exchange of experience , management of conflicts and disputes, with the strengthening of the effectiveness of development programs and activities in general whether established by the Assembly or the local development programs based on the submission of other institutions in society.

Play board members of NGOs great efforts for the success of development programs undertaken by their institutions, and therefore interested in the current research, identify components of facilitation available to the members of the boards of NGOs, whether knowledge or skills as well as identifying their roles as facilitators, whether related to consolidation to take advantage of community residents of community services or roles relating to activating the working groups within or outside the organization and finally stand on the facilitation methods used, such as mediation, problem solving and training for capacity building, and finally to

determine the community-based services that use facilitation.

The study falls under the descriptive studies, using social survey method of both types, covering all members of the boards of NGOs selected and numbered (107) single, and also sample the number of intentional sixteen Assembly at the Centre and the city of Fayoum.

Most important results of the study:

1 - Available to the members of the boards of NGOs to facilitate community-based services components of the level is weak, both components of knowledge or skill.

2 - The members of the boards of NGOs roles associated with the facilitation of community services level is weak, and that both roles associated with the revitalization of community derives from the community services available, or those roles associated with the organization of working groups within or outside the Assembly, and also requires improving the performance of their role as facilitators of community services "Revitalization community residents to take advantage of the services available and the organization of working groups inside and outside the Assembly, "particularly in connection with the exchange of experiences among the personnel of the association and the association to encourage workers to establish a constructive dialogue with community residents.

3 - Use the members of the boards of NGOs, the level of facilitation methods is weak, but they use the method of mediation in the first place, followed by training, and then solve problems.

4 - According to the facilitation in the provision of community services a variety of community residents, as reported sample of the study to facilitate the twelve service to community residents came services associated with the provision of pensions of all kinds and free check, and dispensing of medicines and extract the official papers and treatment at the expense of the State in the top five, and less use of facilitation in some services, such as surgery and to provide facilities for the establishment of small enterprises and the settlement of disputes and conflicts, and security services, legal and voter registration card.

5 - The study recommended the establishment of an office or an advisory committee to facilitate community-based services in communities with a membership number (2) of the members of the Board of Directors and a social worker coach .
