



The Social Impacts of Government Subsidy Policies on Satisfying the Basic Needs of the Poor in Egypt

-Abstract:

The present study aimed at determining the effects of government subsidy policies on the ability of the poor to access food needs, on the ability of the poor to meet health needs, on the ability of the poor to access educational needs, on identifying the constraints facing government support policies in satisfying the basic needs of the poor, The study aimed at reaching proposals to activate government support policies in satisfying the basic needs of the poor, In order to achieve the objectives of the study, a questionnaire was developed based on the theoretical literature and related studies. The tool consists of (67) phrase in addition to Initial data distributed as follows: Initial data (7) questions, Food needs (17)phrase, health needs (15) phrase, educational needs (15) phrase, , obstacles (10) phrase, suggestions for activating (10) phrase, and verified their validity and stability, and applied the study on a sample of (230) single, The study found several results: The results of the study showed that there are a number of effects of the government subsidy policies on satisfying the food needs of the poor, including: Providing the basic needs - the need to continue the ration card system - that the food support does not reach the actual beneficiaries - Monetary support did not contribute to solving the problem of support The results showed that there are a number of effects on satisfying the health needs of the poor, including: Discrimination in the treatment between rich and poor -Government service is less quality than its own - alsoNon-human - does not respect the dignity of the poor – insufficient, The results showed that there are a number of effects on satisfying the educational needs of the poor, including: that education in favor of the rich - does not develop the skills required in the labor market educational service is not good. The study also revealed a number of obstacles and mechanisms to activate the government subsidy policies in satisfying the basic needs of the poor.
