Arabic calligraphy is one of the most distinguished arts in the field of visual arts. It is a product of the aesthetics and values of Islamic art, which carries the characteristics of Islamic culture. This inspires the role of bacteriography in reviving the Egyptian artistic heritage, especially Islamic art, which achieves contemporary Islamic art with a new generation of contemporary Egyptian artists.
