

**Comedonal Lesions on the Trunk and Proximal Extremities:**  
**Answer.**

A 23-year-old woman presented with multiple asymptomatic discrete tiny follicular comedo-like lesions associated with atrophic pitted scars distributed over the upper trunk and proximal extremities. The condition had a progressive course over 2 years. On physical examination, hyperpigmented macules on the neck and in both axillae were discovered.

The patient was not aware of them. She had no positive family history. A 3-mm punch skin biopsy was taken from a comedo like lesion and histopathological examination revealed:

basketweave orthokeratosis and mild epidermal hyperplasia along with a cystically dilated keratin-filled infundibulum (comedonal cyst). Multiple thin branching pigmented epithelial proliferations were seen arising from the wall of the cyst
