The rule of the family of Muhammad Ali Pasha (1805-1953 AD) left many monuments and artifacts all over Egypt, these monuments and objects are rich with architectural and artistic elements as they are a homogeneous mixture of civilizations of previous ages in addition to modern European civilization. The collection of glass tableware from the era of the family of Muhammad Ali Pasha is one of the important objects in Kom Oshim Museum in Fayoum, as the tools of food and drink give a clear expression of the social and political situation. This research aims to study unpublished collection (nine pieces) of crystal tableware, diversified in shape and use, through a descriptive and analytical study of its raw materials, industrial methods and decorations. In addition, we can trace
