Islamic Village El-Qasr In Dakhaleh oasis "An archeological touristic study"

The research aims to study Islamic village el-Qasr and develop its tourism to be a pioneer in the field of tourism with the proposal to establish el-Qasr museum in the village to be a scientific and cultural establishment.

Al Qasr Islamic Village is a picturesque village with narrow alleyways, distinctive mud-brick adjoining buildings and enchanting Islamic monuments built during the Ottoman period (1516-1798) as the traditional capital of the Dakhla Oasis in New Valley Governorate. It constitutes an important landmark of Egypt's cultural heritage but unfortunately many of the traditional structures and monuments have not withstood the test of time and are in need of major restoration

Islamic village el-Qasr is of great importance to traditional architecture in Egypt, It is the only complete model of traditional architecture from the Ottoman era. It includes many of the structures that formed the architectural fabric of the Islamic el-Qasr Religious establishments represented in (El hmya Mosque, the mosque of Sheikh Nasr El Din, the Wadah Mosque) and the civil installations represented in the seats, mills, shops and defense facilities. The design of the buildings is identical, making all the houses adjacent to each building
